Dr. William N. Drohan Scholarship

This scholarship is offered by the Coalition for Hemophilia B in memory of Dr. William N. Drohan, a well-known microbiologist and educator who lost his battle with metastatic lung cancer at age 60. He was a pioneer in using molecular biology to produce recombinant proteins and a visionary scientist who dedicated his life to improving the safety of blood and blood products. His other important contributions included investigating prion diseases in the blood supply and developing treatments for traumatic injuries, including fibrin-sealant bandages to stem hemorrhage. Dr. Drohan also served as a member of the board of the Coalition for Hemophilia B and was instrumental in our Coalition's creation.

Amount: Four or more scholarships awarded each year – various amounts
Candidate: Students with hemophilia B or their siblings with a need for funds and have applied to and been accepted at a vocational school or an accredited college/university or graduate school.

Amount: \$18,000 to be distributed in awards of \$500 to \$3,000.

Candidate: Scholarships are meant for people affected by a bleeding disorder. This includes:

- Anyone who has been diagnosed with a bleeding disorder
- Caregivers of a person affected by a bleeding disorder
- Family members in the same household as someone who has a bleeding disorder

For this scholarship, the term “bleeding disorder” is limited to clotting factor deficiency disorders, specifically: hemophilia A, B, and C; von Willebrand disease; factor V (parahemophilia), factor VII, factor X and factor XIII deficiencies. Factor V Leiden is a clotting disorder and is not eligible. Applicants must be seeking education from an accredited college, university, or certified training program.

Awards are primarily merit-based, but financial need might be considered. The applicant is strongly encouraged to include a copy of their current FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) or other statement of need with their application package.
